Welcome to the second Third Mind Books Catalog, devoted to William S. Burroughs on the occasion of his centenary. Every item herein is by, about or features a contribution from this great American author, artist and icon of the Beat Generation and beyond.

One hundred years after his birth, and seventeen years after his passing, WSB's life and work are getting more attention than ever. Many academic conferences, events, exhibits and premiers have taken place this year to mark the milestone: At the University of Kansas in Lawrence (WSB's last residence); Indiana University in Bloomington; CUNY in NYC and elsewhere in the USA and all over the world. The classic documentary by Howard Brookner, *Burroughs: The Movie*, has been beautifully restored and re-released by the late director's nephew Aaron Brookner and his team, three decades later.

Among many books issued: The three volumes of WSB's challenging Cut-Up Trilogy, *The Soft Machine, The Ticket that Exploded* and *Nova Express*, have just been re-published, restored and with lengthy introductions and notes by the brilliant Burroughsian Dr. Oliver Harris. A new biography, *Call Me Burroughs*, was recently published to wide acclaim. Written by the great Barry Miles and largely based on research by James Grauerholz, WSB's anointed successor and foremost authority, it is the most comprehensive account of his life to date.

Much more is to come during this centenary year, including the third Conference of the European Beat Studies Network (ebsn.eu), to be held in November in Tangier- to commemorate WSB where he famously resided and composed what became *Naked Lunch*. This writer, your Curator, has participated in the first two Conferences and is greatly looking forward to being a part of the third.

So please enjoy a perusal of the wonderful rarities of this Catalog, as well as our website (thirdmindbooks.com), with these and many more prize collectibles by WSB and other literary luminaries.


The first issue of *Olympia*, published by Maurice Girodias' Olympia Press, publisher of the first edition of William S. Burroughs' *Naked Lunch*. Featuring ten episodes from *The Soft Machine*, The first version of which had just been published earlier that year by Olympia Press. Also contains contributions by Lawrence Durrell & Terry Southern, articles about Paris tramps & chastity belts including many such images, & more. Only 4 issues of this journal were published, in the risque-avant garde spirit of Olympia. In fine condition with only moderate wear to covers, sunning of spine, & a closed tear at the top of pg. 53. 
Published only in the UK, this work combines texts from the Olympia Press editions of *Naked Lunch*, *The Soft Machine & The Ticket That Exploded*, along with new additional material, cut-up & folded-in to form a new work. A very rare William S. 

This issue of the legendary hand-crafted countercultural literary magazine includes two contributions by William S. Burroughs, an early version of *The Last Words of Dutch Schultz* with illustrations by editor-publisher Jeff Nuttall, & Letter to Sunday Times Apamorphine Times. With an illustrated page from the Victorian-era *My Own Magazine* stapled to the front cover; various geometric shapes cut out of front two pages. Various colored mimeo paper sheets stapled across top. Original issues of *My Own Mag* are among the rarest & most important relics of WSB's many contributions to the '60s underground press. This copy is in fine condition, with a few small closed tears to left margin of front sheet, small crease on lower right corner of front sheet, missing edge of lower right rectangular cut-out of second page, not affecting images or text on either side. Some small tears & yellowing to vintage pages were present as inserted into this hand-assembled, notoriously delicate item. Staples beginning to rust. 

A "Special Double Issue" of the literary journal edited, published & with contributions by David Moberg & Jeff Giles, with a collaboration by William S. Burroughs & Brion Gysin, "Pieces," consisting of two pages of dense cut-up text, between which are four pages of facsimiles of hand-written & drawn notebook pages. There are also four illustrations by Joe Brainard (front cover & three alternate covers) & contributions by Ted Berrigan, Barbara Guest, Peter Schjeldahl & many others. This issue includes a loose special supplement, consisting of a folded, glued sheet forming a continuous loop of text, which is present in this copy. A wonderful example of WSB's prodigious participation in myriad small journals during the 1960s, in fine condition with only browning, mild soiling & spotting of front & rear covers, small chips across & closed tear at staples of spine, very minor bumps at corners of front cover, staples beginning to rust. 

This issue of the venerable literary journal includes the first appearance of one of the most well-known & important interviews of William S. Burroughs, conducted in his birthplace of St. Louis, MO when he revisited there briefly in 1965. Conducted by the seasoned biographer-journalist Conrad Knickerbocker, this lengthy interview is full of insight into the life & work of WSB from himself in middle age, still being plumbed by scholars. Preceding the interview is a photograph of WSB in Paris from 1960 taken by Charles Henri Ford, & it is interspersed with facsimiles of three pages from WSB's journal that he created while in St. Louis, cut-up collages of texts & images. Following the interview is "St. Louis Return," a diary-essay-journal hybrid by WSB. Elegaic, reflective, quintessentially Burroughsian, it is another classic in his canon. Both pieces are under the formal over-title of "The Art of Fiction XXXVI." Also in this issue is an interview with Jazz Giant Dizzy Gillispie, two prose-poems by Edward Dorn, a poem by Ron Padgett, another by Aram Saroyan, & more. A very important WSB item, in fine condition with only very mild rubbing & soiling to front & back covers, minor chipping, creasing & soiling to spine. 

The second edition of this very rare item by William S. Burroughs, preceded by the virtually unobtainable first edition by Ed Sanders, which was rejected by WSB & consisted of no more than ten-twenty copies (Maynard & Miles A12a pgs. 54-57). A photo-offset of a WSB manuscript, three thousand copies were printed of this edition according to publisher's estimate. This copy is from the personal collection of Charles Plymell & Pamela Beach Plymell, the producers of this edition. Mary Beach & Claude Pelieu were Pamela Beach Plymell's mother & stepfather, & Charles Plymell's in-laws. All four of these well-known writers, artists & publishers were close friends & associates of WSB. Charles & Pamela Plymell's Cherry Valley Editions also published several works by WSB. A very important WSB rarity with significant provenance, in near-fine condition with only mild creases to upper right corner & left edge-spine of front cover, very small closed tear at top edge of front cover, faint circular stain at middle right edge of front cover (possibly as issued), mild crease at lower left corner of rear cover. 



One of the most exemplary artifacts of the fertile literary scene in the lower east side of NYC during the 1960s. The very first, & apparently last, issue of this journal with a veritable who's-who of the original members of the Beat Generation & their immediate progeny at the moment of explosive evolution into the psychedelic hippie counterculture. William S. Burroughs contributes a story, "Fun & Games, What?," preceded by a contemporary author photograph taking up a whole page, with the title & author in facsimile handwriting, below which is WSB's original signature, all on his brow just above his cool eyeglasses (a pagesize negative image of the photo is interspersed further in the story). Also poetry by Robert Bly, Gregory Corso, Allen Ginsberg, Norman Mailer, Michael McClure, Peter Orlovsky, Kenneth Patchen, Gary Snyder, John Weiners & many others; fiction & reviews. Many vintage ads, illustrations, graphics & images that perfectly evoke the legend of "the sixties" as we've come to know it. A delightful & important item, substantially & aesthetically. In generally good condition somewhat worse for wear in a way that we think further symbolizes its time & place, with circular drink stains (!) at middle-lower left of front cover at blank area, some wear, spotting, soiling & creases to front & back covers & spine, small hand-writings in pen at upper right front cover & lower left back covers, mild creasing at corners & browning to otherwise fine interior. 
This is the double issue of the literary journal edited by Allen De Loach, dedicated to works by & about William S. Burroughs. The WSB pieces compiled in this issue, some reprinted from previous small publishers & some appearing for the first time here, include Salt Chunk Mary, Roosevelt after Inauguration & a letter to Allen Ginsberg. Among the pieces about WSB are contributions by Barry Miles, Claude Pelieu & Carl Weissner. Cover calligraphic illustration by Brion Gysin. 

William S. Burroughs (under his old literary alias 'William Lee') is listed as "Editor In Chief" of this enigmatic rarity, along with Brion Gysin ("Brion Gys") as "Layout Manager." A special publication of the Intrepid Press by its editor, Allen De Loach (1939-2002), the poet & publisher at the center of the NYC Lower East Side literary scene of the 1960s, a close friend & associate of WSB & many others important Beat figures. As he writes, this bulletin "actually evolved out of various letters the author (De Loach) was writing concurrently to William Burroughs, Brion Gysin, Eric Mottram, and members of the Grey Insurrection..." And so, this is a cut-up style compilation of De Loach's & found writings along with various images, directly following WSB's methods. Besides his editorship, WSB's own writing may be mixed in, including references to Dr. Benway. This copy has very special provenance: It is signed and dated in the year of publication by De Loach & inscribed to Mary Beach, who along with her husband Claude Pelieu is listed among the "Silent Grey Insurrectionists" who somehow contributed to this issue. Beach & Pelieu were both also close friends and collaborators with WSB. In near-fine condition with only very small bumpcreases at lower corners, minor edging esp. at spine, slight browning at edge of wrappers.


TIME, by William S. Burroughs, with drawings by Brion Gysin, was originally published by Ted Berrigan's C Press in 1965. This is the Urgency Press Rip-Off Edition, one of 495 copies printed on a mimeograph duplicator for distribution at the Bickershaw Festival in the UK. A doubly underground version of an iconic example of WSB's efforts to subvert the pre-recorded universe, as exemplified by the sinister monopoly of "Time, Life & Fortune" by the established media! This issue of the literary journal edited by Michael Andre features a short, complimentary piece about Claude Pelieu by William S. Burroughs dated January 23, 1968; "This piece was intended as an introduction to one of Claude Pelieu's books and was sent to him when he was living in San Francisco. The letter never arrived. How this statement reached Unmuzzled Ox is a mystery." The text of a letter to Pelieu & his wife/collaborator Mary Beach from Allen Ginsberg; cover drawing, logo & several illustrations by R. Crumb & much more. This copy once belonged to Peggy Biderman, artist, filmmaker & friend of Beach, Pelieu, Gregory Corso, Allen Ginsberg & many others in the Beat canon. 
AQ 14 is an anthology of the cut-up; the experimental method developed by William S. Burroughs, Brion Gysin, Harold Norse and others. Includes three pieces by WSB, a composition of his own (translated into German) & two cut-ups of works by Pound & Rimbaud. Also includes contributions by Mary Beach, Claude Pelieu, Jeff Nuttall, Harold Norse, Charles Plymell and others. Carl Weissner, WSB's friend & German translator has supplied a cut-up Checklist, a necessary bibliographic reference for all WSB collectors. Also includes a tipped-in insert at inner back cover, now loose but intact. German and English text. An important item in near fine condition with only very minor rubbing & creasing to wrappers, small closed tears at staples, some spotting to two glossy pages, most of interior is matte-finish paper in very fine condition. 



Taken at a Columbia University Reading on April 17, 1975 by noted photographer Fred W. McDarrah. Black & white gelatin hand print from the original negative by McDarrah. Caption written on back by McDarrah, with his signature above his address label which is affixed to the back of the photo. Burroughs appears in tweed jacket and tie, gazing to the right. A wonderful image of WSB from shortly into the time period of his return to NYC after a quarter-century of legendary wanderings. McDarrah original prints are rarely offered outside the gallery market. In near-fine condition with very feint horizontal creases across near top & bottom.



A great rarity full of insight by & about WSB, in very fine condition with only very slight browning & creasing to covers & staples beginning to rust.

A most tragic figure in the WSB legend, "cursed from birth" as he put it himself, WSB Jr. (actually William S. Burroughs III to be exact) died less than three years after this broadside was published at the age of thirty-three. A very rare artifact in very fine condition, with only mild horizontal creases along lower area, rough edges & tumbled texture with faint horizontal creases as issued, old price (in British pounds) & seller's reference in light pencil at top right corner. 
"Port of Saints is the mind-boggling story of a man whose alternate selves take him on a fantastic journey through space, time, and sexuality. The last work written by William S. Burroughs before his return to the United States in 1973, PORT OF SAINTS is partly experimental autobiography, partly profound exploration of the concept of sexuality, partly nightmare voyage through revolting alien sexual fantasy to the depths of the psyche: in short, an ultimate foray into that rich, savage landscape first depicted in Naked Lunch and The Wild Boys." (front flap) First published in a limited edition in the UK with an alternate text in 1973, this is the first U.S. trade edition. This copy is signed by WSB on the title page, although it is not one of the numbered boxed sets offered by the publisher concurrently with this edition. Extremely rare & unique among WSB items. Book, bound in linen-like cloth with copper-gold stamping, in very fine condition, dust jacket in near fine condition with small chips & creases at front left top, & some minor wear at corners, top & bottom of spine panel.

A very obscure item from the late underground-mimeo "zine" era. Really a parody, with humorous references to various collectible editions on title page. On the back cover is a hand-written limitation, showing that this is No. 6 of 32 copies. Sheets roughly xerox-printed on one side only, copies of myriad texts & images including a 1979 letter from LSD-discoverer Dr. Albert Hoffman to Brion Gysin, collages, poetry, a fake news item on the death of Charles Bukowski (who was alive at the time), & most interestingly of all, several page-size copies of vintage photographs of William S. Burroughs in the South American jungle circa 1953 (the period depicted in The Yage Letters), wearing his pith helmet, posing with native children & brandishing a rifle. There is also a copy of a page of cutup text & collage, probably from one of WSB's scrapbooks. We have seen the photos reproduced elsewhere, but mostly in items published since this strange bootleggish parody. Who published this & where cannot be positively determined. In very fine condition with only some very mild browning & soiling to front & back covers, two uppermost staples do not fully penetrate the entire stack of sheets as issued. A tiny gem, the third number in a small series, with five very short poems by John Bennett, John Giorno & others; & a vintage piece of prose by William S. Burroughs, a riff-rant against fundamentalism familiar to his devoted readers. Each contribution takes up a panel, among four created by folding an oblong sheet, with printing on both sides, accordian style. A very rare item from the year when WSB left his Bunker in NYC (still kept by Giorno in the now-gentrifying Bowery neighborhood) & retired to Lawrence, Kansas for his relatively serene & very productive last phase. 

A rare relic from the heyday of WSB on the reading circuit, in very fine condition, virtually mint, with only very tiny bumps at three corners, very small crease at upper left corner, mildest rubbing to edges. 
This issue of the literary journal published at the University of Kansas is mostly dedicated to the River City Reunion event that took place in Lawrence, Kansas in September 1987. William S. Burroughs, then a resident of Lawrence, was featured along with many other Beat & countercultural luminaries including Allen Ginsberg, John Giorno, Timothy Leary & Anne Waldman; & their literary & artistic progeny including Jello Biafra, Jim Carroll & Keith Haring. Featuring an interview with WSB conducted by George Wedge with Steven Lowe, & color reproductions of two WSB artworks on the front & back covers. 



1947-2013

This catalog is dedicated to the memory of Karl Pohrt, who passed away on July 10, 2013.

A world-renowned bookseller, publisher, journalist, educator and humanitarian; Karl was especially beloved in our hometown of Ann Arbor, Michigan, where he was a bridge between the University of Michigan and the larger intellectual and literary community. In recognition of his work, a prestigious chair at the University was named in his honor.

Most of all to us at Third Mind Books, Karl was our inspiration and mentor. Your curator was privileged to be his friend, to whom he lavished his collaboration and guidance. To highlight a few among many of his efforts on our behalf: Our first Catalog was largely the result of his extensive participation, and he helped me greatly to create my first presentation at the first European Beat Studies Network Conference. He also accompanied me to and assisted me at the Conference in the Netherlands, as well as to a related interview in upstate New York that preceded it.

Karl's contribution to Third Mind Books and its Curator's independent scholarship was profound and incalculable. His passing is a great loss to us and many others, but his legacy lives on in this and all our future endeavors.
